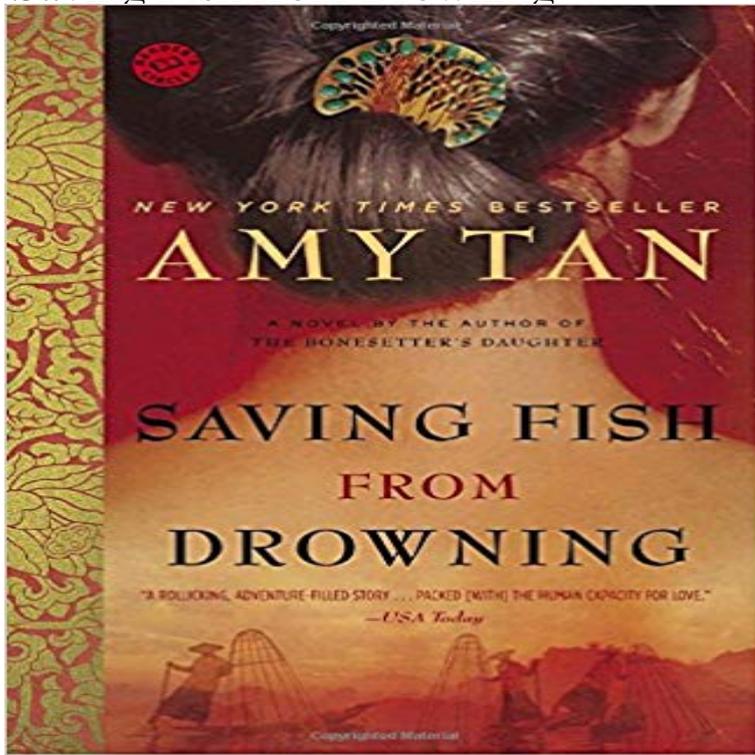


Saving Fish from Drowning
