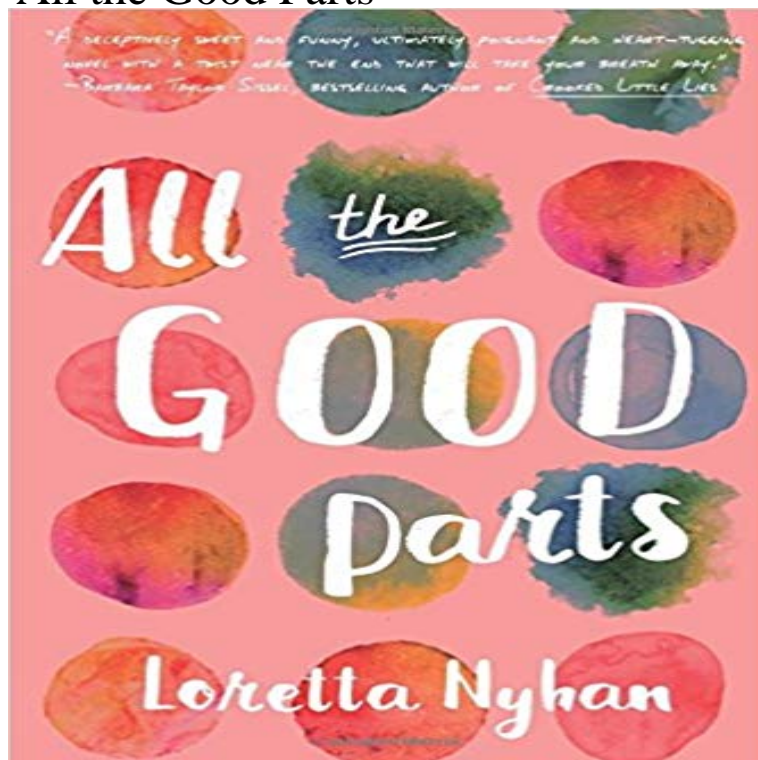


All the Good Parts
