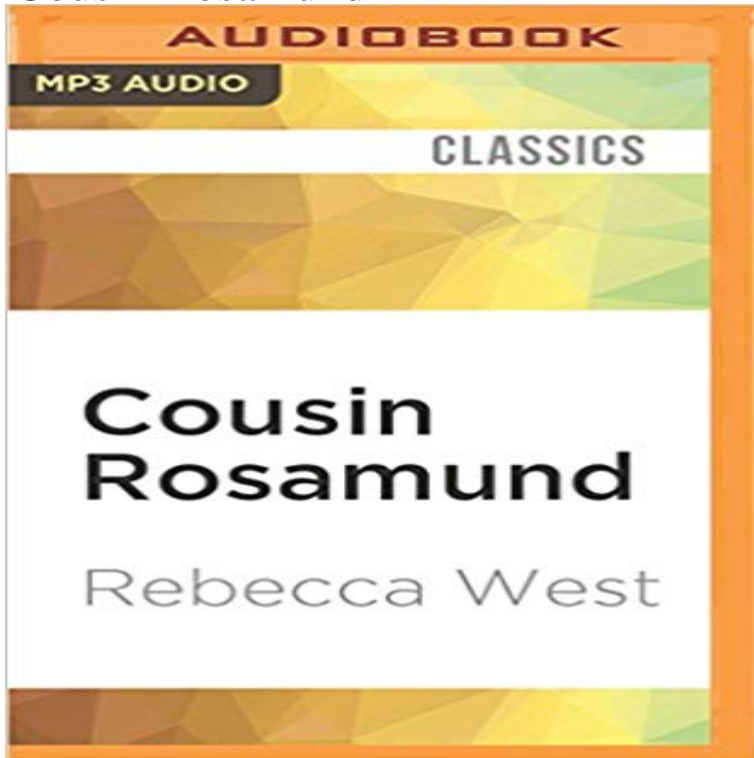


Cousin Rosamund
