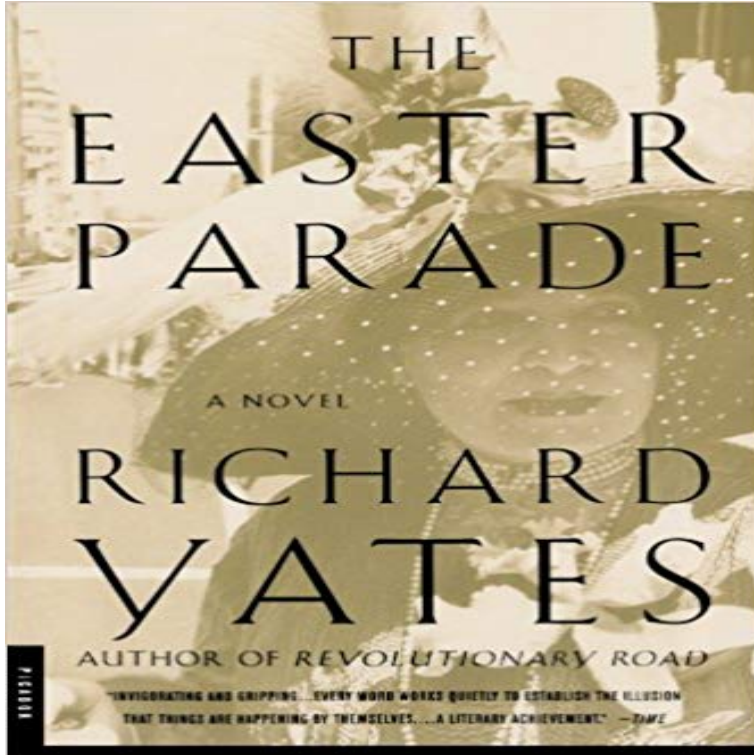


## The Easter Parade: A Novel
