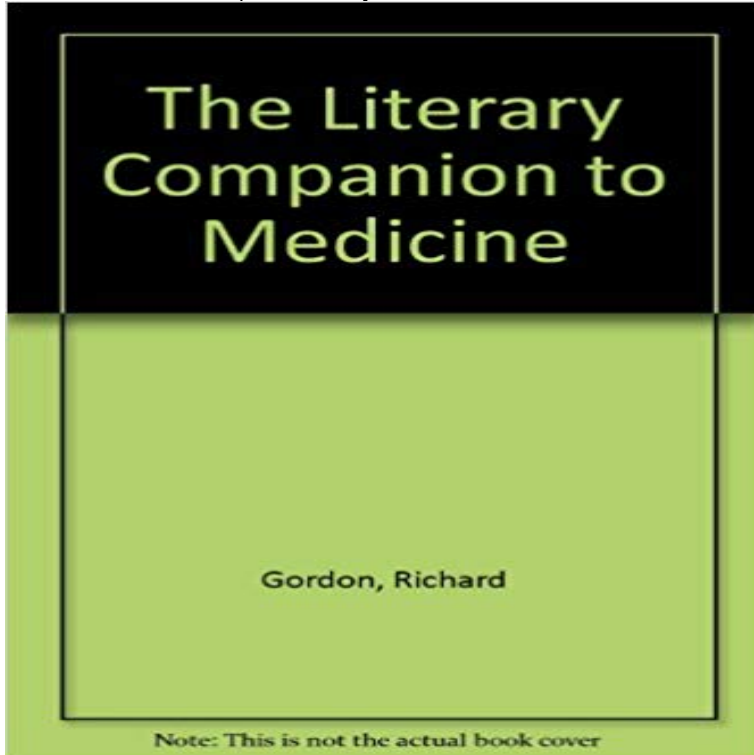


The Literary Companion to Medicine
