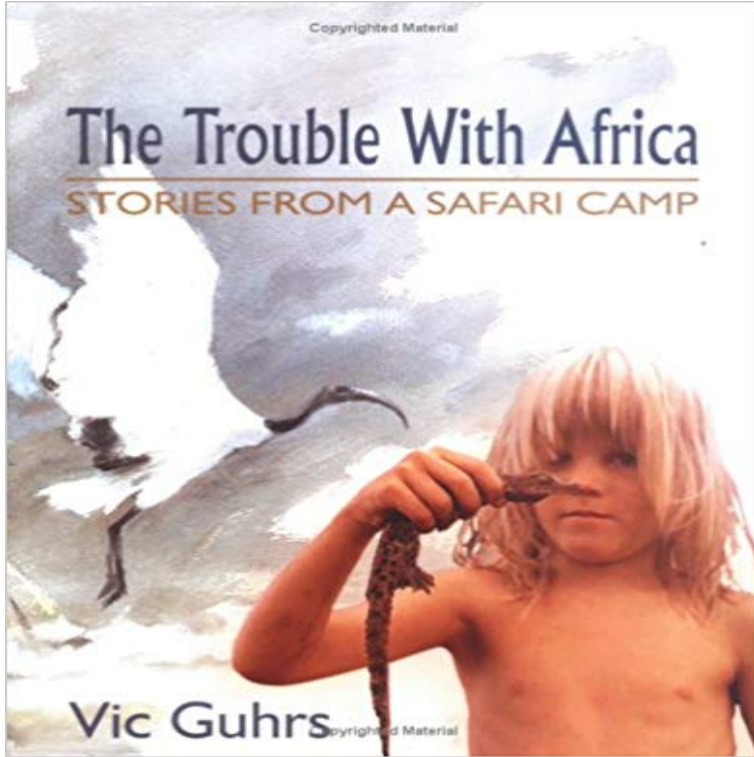


# The Trouble with Africa
