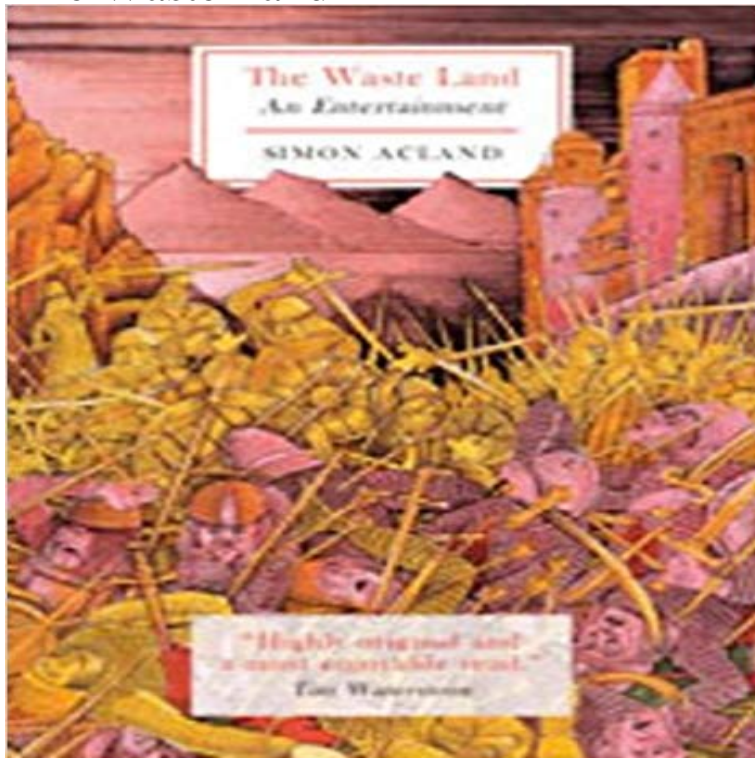


# The Waste Land
