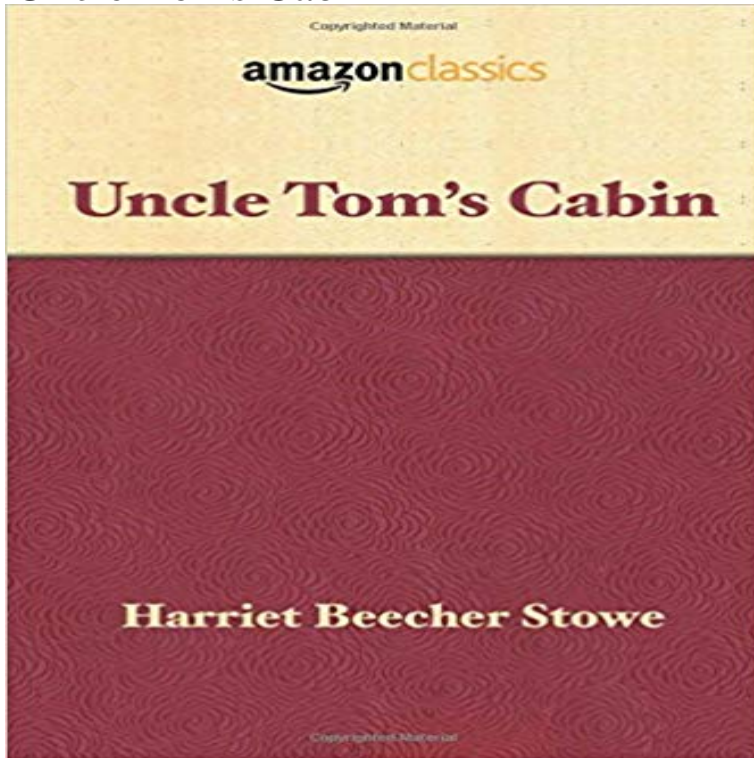


# Uncle Toms Cabin
